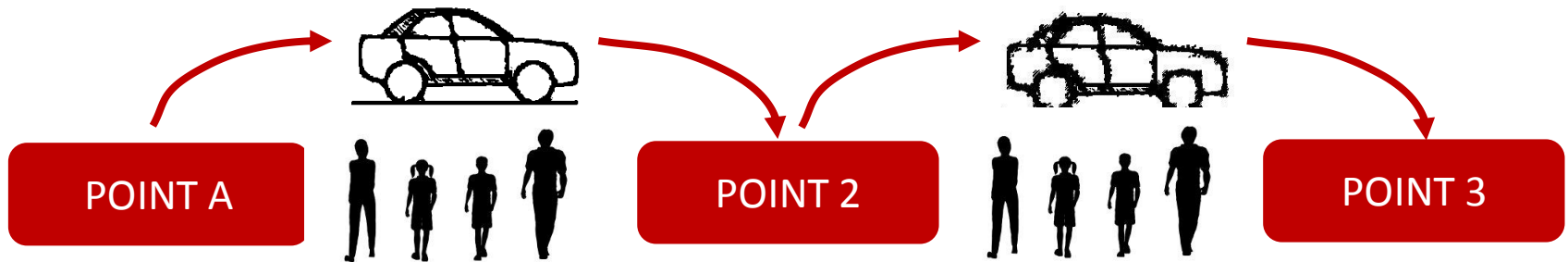


SPECTATOR POINTS IN RED.

These points are where families can join the cart on its journey. Spectators are encouraged to walk with the cart and hand out Donation Cards. In certain places it is also possible to cycle (see individual Legs). A person will be at each Spectator point about 20+ minutes before the cart arrives.

Families will need to work out how they will walk the route and get picked up at the other end. Car sharing is suggested. Walking back is possible. **PARENTS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR THEIR OWN CHILDREN AT ALL TIMES**

**SPECTATOR POINTS IN BLACK**

If ADULTS wish to join in pulling the cart, then these points are the best places to join. Vans will be waiting at these points ahead of the Cart. Twitter (@1stWinchester) will update on progress and use these as reference points. Families can come to these points and support the progress of the cart as it enters and exits. Anyone doing so is encouraged to hand out Donation Cards to passers by as we cannot collect in many places along the route.

Spectator Point 1 – Sandbanks

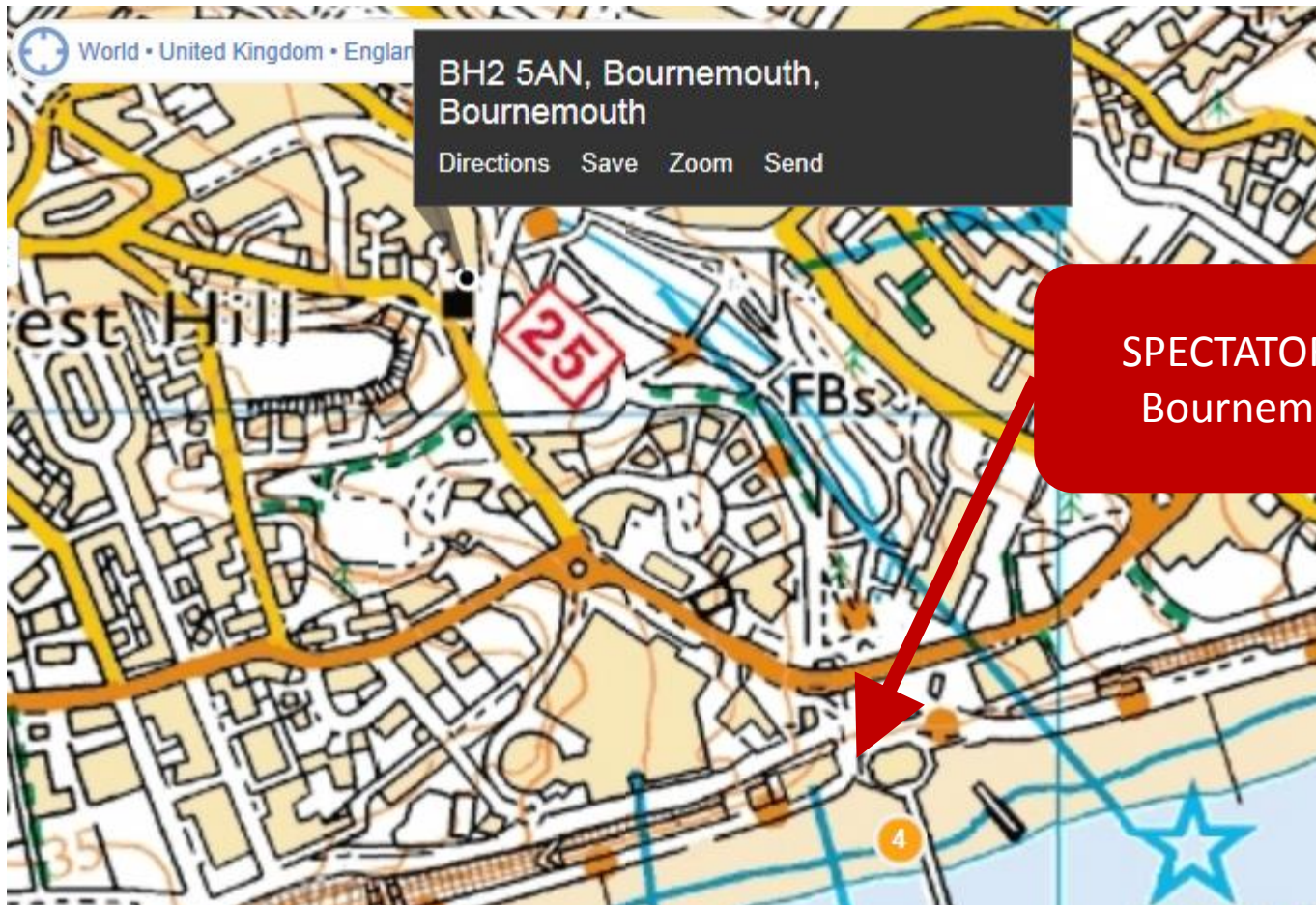


SPECTATOR POINT 1.

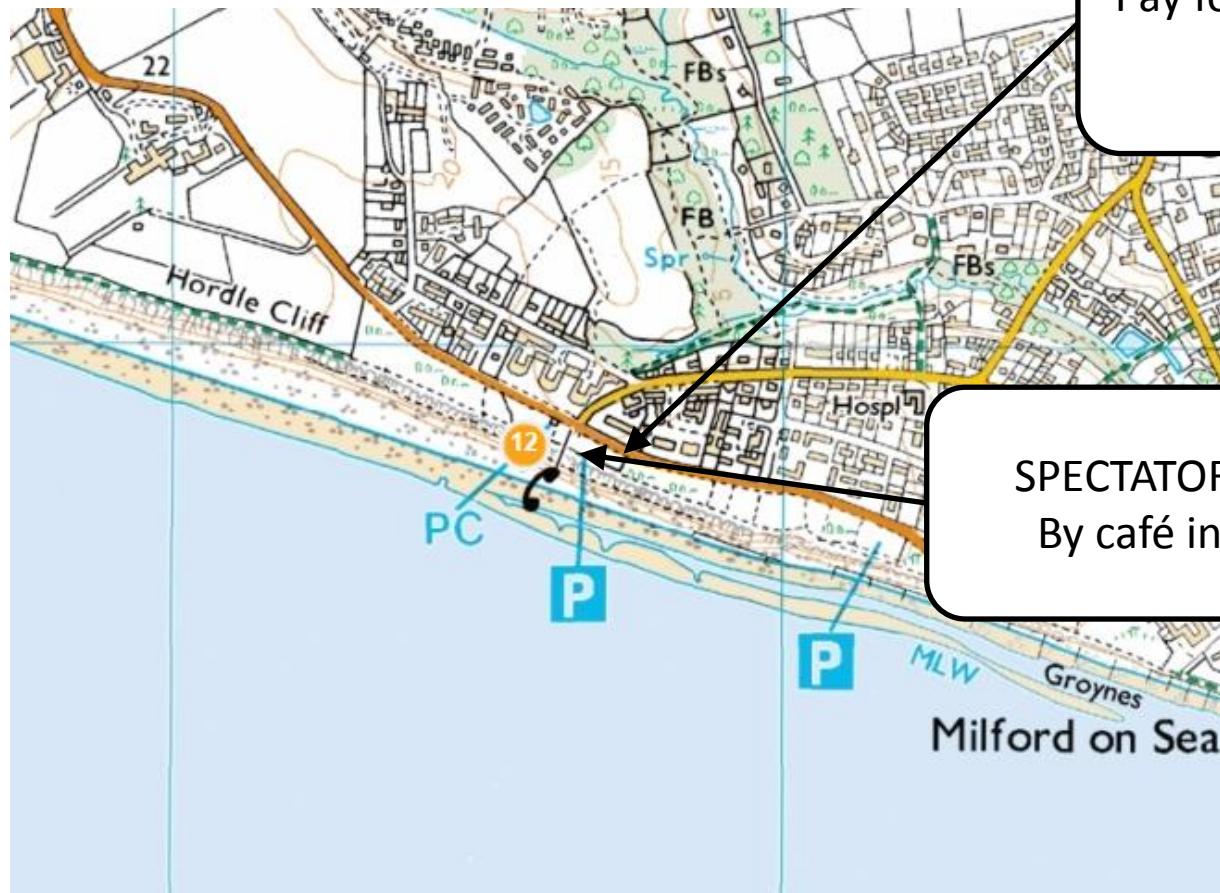

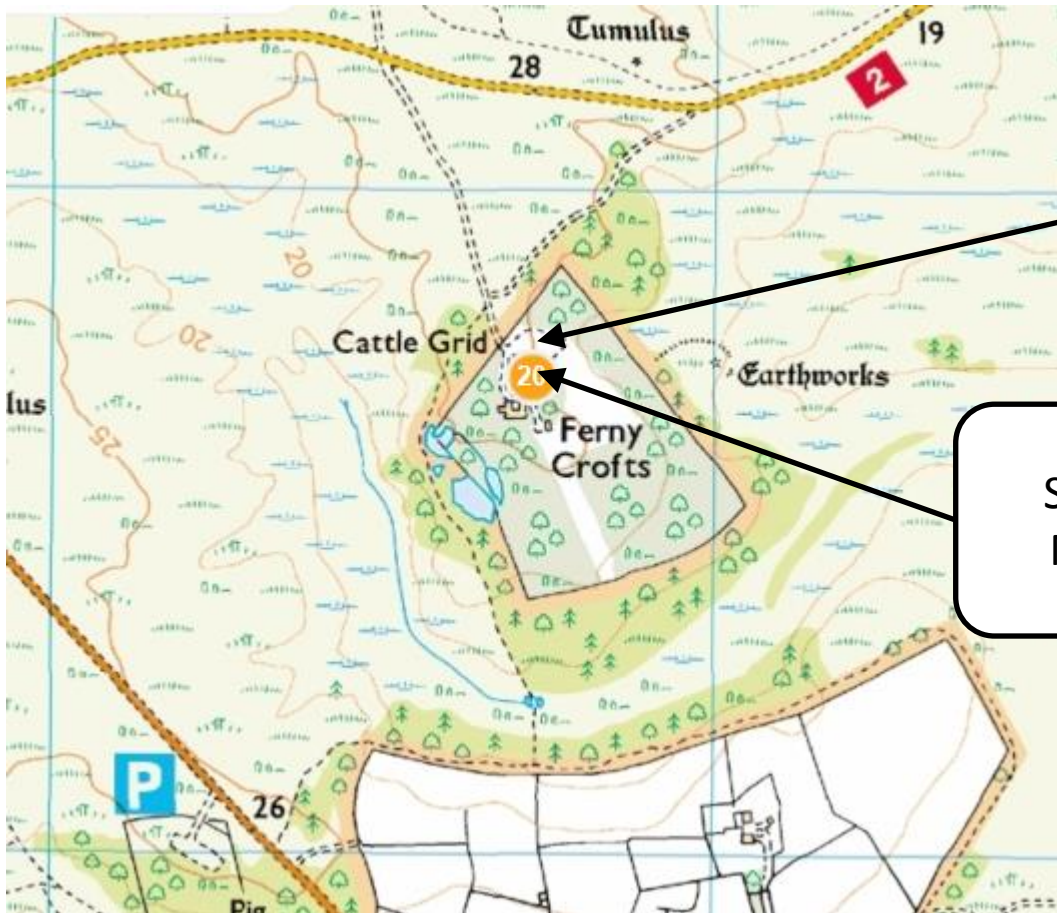

Spectator Point 8 – Ferney Crofts Scout camp



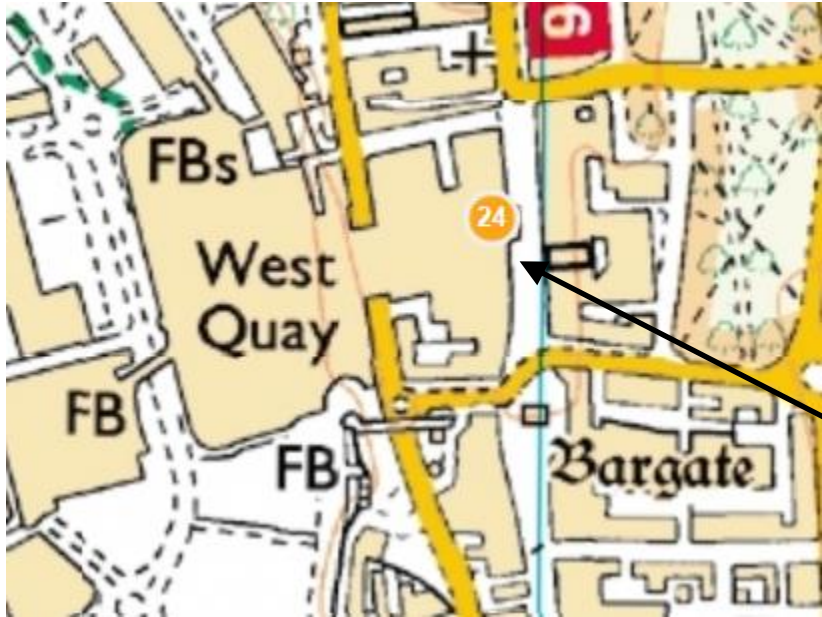
Parking at top of campsite

Spectator Point 9 – West Quay Shopping Centre

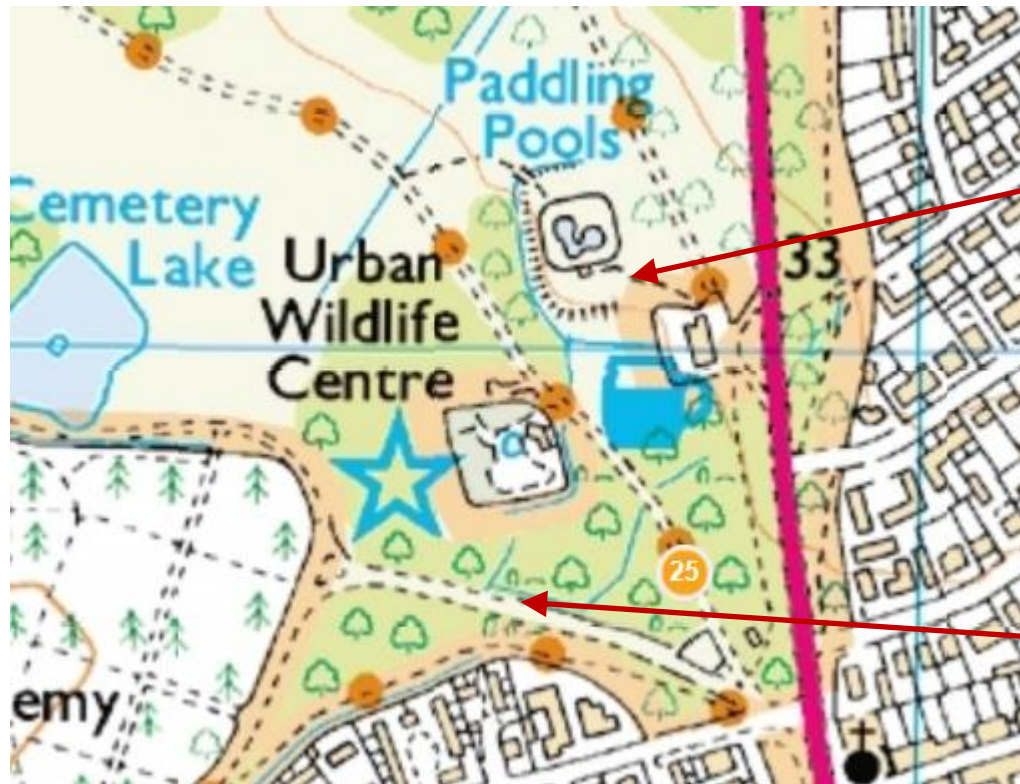

Spectator Point 10 – Southampton Common



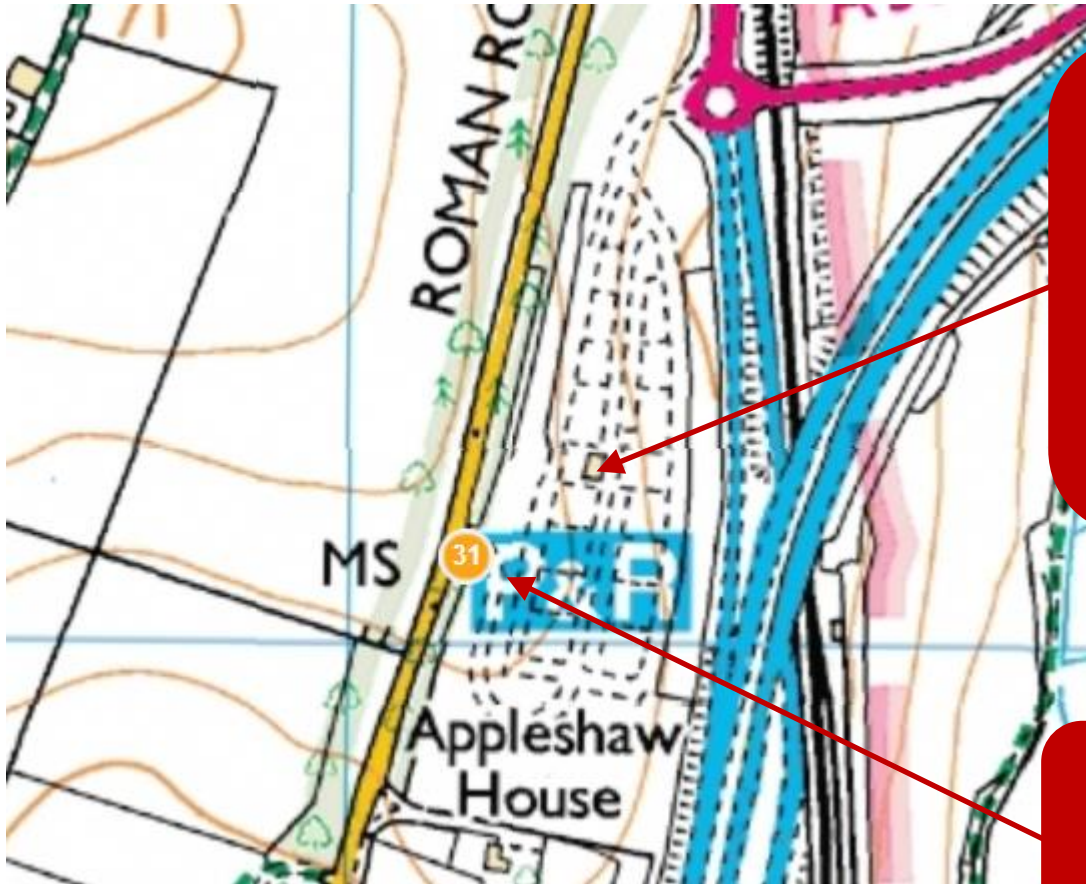
SPECTATOR POINT 10.

Spectator Point 11 – South Winchester Park and Ride



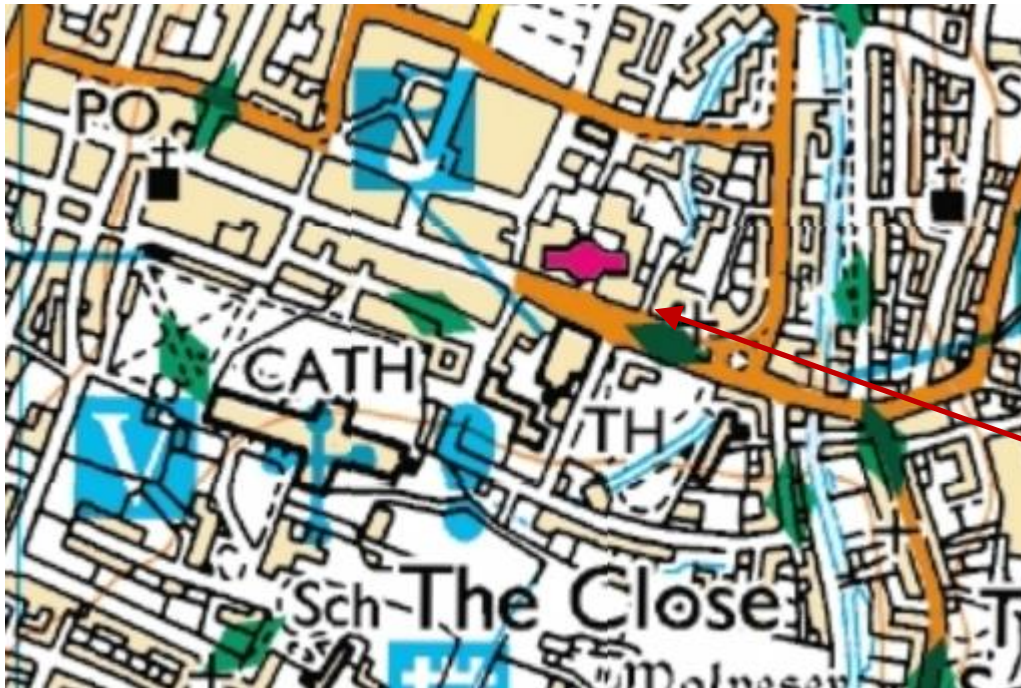
Parking is free on Sunday. No P&R running. Parents are encouraged to drop children and other adults here and then pick them up at The Broadway.
